

On Saturday breeze was up right at the class limits for a sanctioned regatta. It was frontal, and backside, so, it was dry--no squall. We had a safety briefing at the Skipper's Meeting, which proved helpful. We had one boat go over in the first race. The race was great and competitive. Newman gave it away by getting the spinnaker fouled in the last jibe to the finish and Steve Harris planed right by.

In the second race, on the first downwind leg, we had a series of about five gusts that caught the fleet under spinnaker and knocked four boats over. Team Newman, being one of the four, was in front and in complete control on a plane, and just got pushed over before they could react. The gust was so strong it exploded the Harken cleat on the guy.

PRO Darren Rose immediately abandoned with the gusts now above the limit. We got everyone back to the club. Except for Darren's daughter, all of the boats were none the worse for wear—a few mast flies, a broken cleat, and a lost paddle. Darren's daughter, Charlotte Rose (the Laser Radial World Youth Champ), got the mast stuck in the bottom and it broke. It was a pity. She only had around 400 lbs on the boat, and she still managed third in the first race and was third or fourth when they went over.

Sunday was light air, and we got two races in before it died. Ian had an extra mast, so, Charlotte was able to sail. Unfortunately, they had a mishap at the hoist after the regatta and managed to break the new one as well. Darren was shell shocked. He said the acronym for BOAT was, "Break out another thousand."
