Fleet 3 staged sen Sunday afternoon races, the final winner again being Jack Orelup, with John Wardell second and Ritner E. Walling, III third.


In the Wednesday Junior Series, after twelve races, the results were: William W. Fortenbaugh first, Robert Woolman second and Ritner K. Walling, III third,




