





Ed Kruszona took the Fleer 13 championship and the Bennett trophy for the second consecutive season, although by a much closer margin than last year. Last season we had several starts with twelve Lightnings, and if the growth continues, we should have twenty boat starts.

Our race committee boat was ably manned again this year by Mr. Ray Kruszona, father of the fleet champion. His excellent handling of the committee boat enabled us to have good starts throughout the season.

The host yacht club at Mayfield is installing a launching facility that is causing us to think of invitational regattas. Before long, fleets in central New York can expect an invitation to sail with us.


