





One of the most interesting events of the 1959 season were our annual "Interclubs" races for the "Pancho Piazza Trophy" which were held in Ancon waters on March 7, 14 and 19, 1959. Four clubs participated: Yacht Club Peruano, Yacht Club Ancon, Club Regatas Lima and Yacht Club Paracas. The three race series were highly competitive. Yacht Club Peruano won and was repre-sented by skippers, Carlos Navarro, Jr., Jost Kursell, Manuel Gutierrez and John Russell.

In May 1959 six races were held for the Peruvian Lightning Championship. The winner was Carlos Navarro, Jr., who retained the title for the fifth consecutive year. The runner-up was Jost Kursell. The other places were as follows: Stuart Monro, Pablo Rosello, John Russell, Jose Barreda Moller, Alberto Canepa, Luis Alvarez Maza, Franco Carbone, Manuel Gutierrez and Raul Dianderas.

In August 1959, in Bogota, Colombia, the fifth South American Championship was held. Our country was represented by Jost Kursell of our fleet, and his crew, Manuel Jose Ayulo and Juan Lanfranco.

Also in August 1959, the Pan American Championships were held in Chicago as a part of the Pan American Games. According to the invitation, our country nominated the following crew to be represented: Carlos Navatro, Jr. as skipper along with his father, the writer of this report, and Enrique Conterno as crew-men. We went to Chicago despite the long trip and the expensive airplane fares. Unfortunately the organization was deficient in several vital points thus taking away the interest expected for this event. However, it was a new experience.

Next season should be very active and we are ready to do our best for it. On February, 1960, the Sixth South American Light-ning Championships will be held in Chile and our country will be represented by three duly selected skippers and their crews.



Our fleet champion, Mitch Bohnenkamp turned in a superb season of racing. He was on top of the pack all season and he and his fine crew deserve a round of applause.


Jim Mitchell, runner-up, who is getting his Lightning legs,


We are looking forward to another full season next year and hope to see our fleet grow and become more competitive in the years to come.

All in all a fine season-with hopes of a bigger class next year.




