He met his wife Tay (the former Thayer Reisner of Milwaukee and Gull Lake Y.C.) at the 1954 Internationals, and she has been his steady crew since 1958. The Adams have three young sailing daughters - Jenny, Bonnie and Chris.

Bob has served the class in the capacity of CAD Commodore, V.P. Publicity, Chairman IRC, Treasurer, Assistant and Chief Measurer. He was a member of the Executive Committee for two years prior to becoming President.

A graduate of Princeton University in 1957 and Wharton Graduate School in 1961, he is Vice-Chairman of Roselon Industries, Inc., a publicly held textile manufacturer.
