

Bob has raced Lightnings since 1949, having competed in 22 of the last 25 NA's and in 3 World Championships (Naples, Buffalo and Salinas).

His first of six Lightnings was #2457, purchased off the floor of the New York Boat Show and jointly owned by and co-skipped with his sister, Marge Adams Alexander. He met his wife Tay (the former Thayer Reisner of Milwaukee and Gull Lake Y.C.) at the 1954 Internationals, and she has been his steady crew since 1958. The Adams have three young sailing daughters - Jenny, Bonnie and Chris.

Bob has served the class in the capacity of CAD Commodore, V.P. Publicity, Chairman IRC, Treasurer, Assistant and Chief Measurer. He was a member of the Executive Committee for two years prior to becoming President.

A graduate of Princeton University in 1957 and Wharton Graduate School in 1961, he is Vice-Chairman of Roselon Industries, Inc., a publicly held textile manufacturer.

The Adams are members of Fleet 3, sailing at Barnegat Bay, New Jersey, the Bay Head Yacht Club, site of the First International Lightning Championship.

Since the time John first started sailing the Lightning at Buckeye Lake in Ohio, he has moved more than any other Lightning owner of record. Taking his boat along each time, he has belonged to the Ohio, Dixie, and Metropolitan Districts, serving as Commodore of the latter for two years.

John's first Lightning was 5559, he now races 13003, with five other boats between. 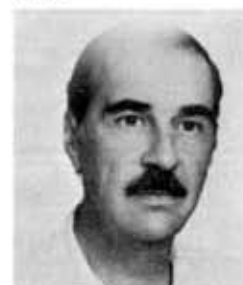
