Bill Oliver sailing with his sons in a new boat was often spookily fast. Although Bill placed in no series in Wellfleet, he won the State of Maine Championship and had two good races in the Westport regattas, a fourth in the spring and a second in the fall.

In mid-July, Fleet 280 held its first officially scheduled District Championship. Stuart Nickerson and Bill Oliver ran a regatta that was successful in every way except that a local boat did not win. Stuart did his best, winning four of the five races (those sailed in moderate or stronger air). But, in the one race in light and shifty air, Stuart went the wrong way, finished twentieth, and since there were no throw-outs, had a poorer total score in the regatta than Dick Hale, Don Brush, and Jack Burwell. The next local boat was our Champion, the Dickeys, who were twelfth, with others in the fleet finishing from the mid-teens on. As good as the racing was, it was almost surpassed by the beach party extravaganza planned by the fertile mind of Stuart Nickerson.

It appears that Fleet 280 may be on the upswing again. With three boats added in 1978 and Bob Campbell the new owner of Jack Burwell's speedy craft. Pres Moore will possibly be back for a full season, and a couple of disappointed Rhodes skippers are showing interest. Next year, 1979, should show more boats on the water than in several years.
