This year began with high hopes, descended to keep depression bordering on paranoia in mid-year and climbed to cautious optimism by seasons end.

Fleet members expected to launch their boats and occupy floats at the Lakeside Marina in April. However, a local group of environmentalists blocked the move. By mid-June our last avenue of appeal under the Washington State Shoreline Protection Act was closed and we had no site. In July discussions were opened with Corinthian Yacht Club of Seattle located at Shilshole Bay on Puget Sound. Since it appears it will be quite a few years before a suitable site will be available on Lake Washington for Lightnings (the old Sand Point Naval Air Station may be developed by the city as a public marina) the Fleet will relocate to Shilshole Bay in 1979 and affiliate with Corinthian Y.C.

The Fleet did attempt some local races on three successive weekends in May launching from the Stan Sayres pits (site of the hydroplane races in Seattle). But even the god of winds was against us. Of the eight attempted races only two were completed, Frank Wise, having trailered his new boat up from Portland only three days earlier, assembled and launched it and won the first race of the season.

Undaunted by local events, John Cournoyer, Bob Forgie, Rod Johnson, Kurt Seiffert, Frank Wise and Greg Zettler took to the road in search of district racing. Usually this group brings home a large share of the silver from these races. This year only Rod and Greg were able to perform anywhere near expectations.

Showing flashes of his old form Rod engaged in a pitched battle for top honors at the Memorial Day regatta in Eugene, Ore., with Phil Parshley, defending District Champion, and Greg Zettler. Rod came out on the shortend taking a third in the twenty-seven boat fleet.

The next district event in Portland, Oregon, found Rod taking a disasterous twentieth in the first race which saw twenty-eight boats on the start line. Most sailors would relax and enjoy the scenery, but not Rod. Battling back with a first and second Rod succeeded in climbing to fifth place by the end of the regatta. Hoping all disasters were behind him, including losing a halyard inside his mast at the Pacific Coast Championship, Rod set out for the District Championship regatta. But there was more to come. With two first places came a good chance of regaining the title he has held twice in the past. But a seventeenth place finish in a frustrating light air race resulted in a fourth overall. Rod returned to the fray one more time at the King Oalf regatta in Seattle. This time fate smiled and Rod had one more regatta win to add to his collection.

Greg Zettler fared somewhat better. After finished second at the Memorial Day regatta, Greg put it all together in Portland. In second place by three-quarters point and only one-quarter point ahead of the third place boat going into the last race, Greg pulled a horizon job out of his bag of tricks in twenty-five knots of wind.

The next test of sailing skill was in Klamath Falls, site of this years Pacific Coast Championship regatta. This one turned into a real donnybrook with Greg Zettler and Myron Lyon of San Diego separated by three-quarters point going into the fifth race. Ten miles later after seven legs of fantastic seamanship by both competitors, Greg nosed out Myron by one foot at the finish line.

Warming up for the Districts Greg took a substitute crew to Vancouver B.C. and won every race by a comfortable margin. But his second District Championship continued to clude him. At Eugene, Ore., site of this years District Championship, Greg, like so many others, was completely mystified by the light and fluky winds and finished fifth. However, the two firsts and a second in circuit regattas assured that Greg would repeat as Pacific Northwest Lightning Circuit Champion.

Frank Wise was the most traveled member of the gypsy band. He attended every district regatta save one and logged some 4800 miles. He also won his first circuit regatta, the Lake Chelan regatta at Chelan, Wash. Tell me Frank, do you think you know how to tell when your aground now?

With our move to Shilshole Bay in the early stages at this writing, the fleet looks forward with cautious optimism to once again enjoying the fantastic sailing available in Seattle and a successful local program.


