



Grande; Angel Vila who had two American crew, Lance Drewes and Ira Johnson; Javier Pascuchi with his wife, Maria, and Dave Peters; Mario Abinzano with his brother, Fidel, and Stewart Thomas; and Anibal Gatti with crew of Antonio Gneri and Walter Gentillini.

Finally, we should mention that Hugo Castro, Rolando Turrado, and Roberto Ricoveri attended the North Americans.

This was a very good effort for us in the International events. Also, the District picked up some boats during this season and at last a new fleet. At our annual meeting, Mario Isola was elected District Commodore and former Commodore Angel Vila was elected Secretary.

California Lightning activity remained at a stable pace of slow but steady growth this past year, in spite of the suspicious gas crisis and the myriad of rationing programs successfully designed to confuse the motoring public.

Although all of the California Fleets enjoy year round sailing, the District Calender is kicked off annually by the popular California Circuit, Patterned after the concept of the east coast's Southern Circuit, our Easter week event, in its thirteenth staging, draws most of the active California boats, as well as several more from our Northwest friends as far away as British Columbia.

Racing on the Circuit begins at the home of Fleet 102, King Harbor Yacht Club, on Palm Sunday. Off-the-course activities can include surfing, swimming, volleyball, sunbathing, deep sea fishing, etc. The racing itself is well organized and the facilities are excellent. The winds are always manageable in the 8 to 12 knot range with oscillating 10 degree shifts. After the conclusion of Monday's race, most of the fleet scoots the two and a half hours to San Diego while some can't resist the stop at Disneyland on the way.

The last two legs of the Circuit are sailed in San Diego, truly the plumb of the Southern California lifestyle. From beautiful Corondao, the fleets sets off on the famous Marathon race, a from here-to-there race starting under th Coronado Bridge and finishing 17 miles later after sailing out San Diego Bay up the Pacific Coast into Mission Bay and to the Mission Bay Yacht Club.

The day following the Marathon is an off-day spent with a trip to

Mexico, the San Diego Zoo, Sea World or just leisurely sailing in Mission Bay. At the bar-b-cue that night is the time to start campaigning for any cause that will prevent racing inside Mission Bay for the last third of the Circuit. This is merely a tradition and has nothing to do with the actual racing conditions "inside" which always provide for INTERESTING events. Compromise prevails and the two ocean triangle races scheduled for Thursday stand with one "inside" extravaganza on Friday.

The Mission Bay Yacht Club has been accepted as the capable host for the 1980 North American Championships. It has been quite a few years since that privilege has visited the West coast and all participants will be assured a super championship and an unforgettable good time. Very few cities in the nation can offer the relaxing comfort of a San Diego vacation. Very few yacht clubs are as easy to enjoy as Mission Bay Yacht Club.

This year was California's turn to host the Pacific Coast Championships. Traditionally, the San Francisco Fleet is charged with the responsibility of this regatta and again found the Richmond Yacht Club willing to sponsor the racing. As usual, they did a super job on the water in varying conditions. Our District dominated the top five spots with Myron Lyon, fifth; Mark Patty, fourth; and Charlie Gotschalk capturing the 1979 Pacific Coast Championship.

Myron Lyon reigns again as the California District Champion with Charlie Gotschalk as runner-up, after a regatta full of surprises in San Diego.

After the Districts, the fleets intermix again for the Billie Boswell Memorial and Hurricane Gultch Regattas hosted by the Santa Monica Bay Fleet and the Bowen Memorial hosted by San Diego. By the end of October, the pace slows down with some respect to our "sort-of" winter. District Officers for 1980 are Commodore Mark Patty and Secretary Quintin Foster.

Next year? Of course, we are looking forward to meeting many of our Lightning friends from other Districts at the North Americans and hope many of you will investigate the San Diego sailing conditions at our Circuit. In either case, we offer all of you the warmest welcome.

The Long John Regatta, held each year at Monmouth Boat Club, was won by Jack Elfman with Jay Lutz finishing sixth, Bill Clausen finishing ninth, and Jim Carson taking tenth.

The highlight of the season, the District Championship, was held in June at the Red Dragon Canoe Club on the Delaware River. The two races on Saturday were characterized by light air with holes. 180 degree wind shifts, and lot of current. Under these most trying conditions. Bucky Kloss and Jay Lutz sailed super races to finish tied after two races, far ahead of the rest of the 30 boat fleet, Bucky won the first

Then in the South Americans in Ancon, Alberto Gonzalez was second and Manuel Gonzalez was third. Their crews were Tristan Aircardi and Fernando Gallyas (Alberto) and Cristian and Juan Pablo Barahona (Manuel).

Chile was also represented in the Worlds by Manuel and Alberto Gonzalez. Manuel and Alberto also participated in the Pan-Am Games with Manuel finishing sixth and Alberto finishing ninth.

Chile will host the XI World Championships and Dr. Hernan Barahona, the Chairman, is working very hard to make this the finest Worlds of all times.

For the next season, our Commodore will be Gerardo Polette with Jaime Silva as Secretary and Hugo Cuneo as Treasurer.

Finnish legislation for associations provides for certain official procedures which differ from those which we are accustomed to using within ILCA. We must have two meetings each year. Our annual meeting was held in November in Helsinki and our electoral meeting was held in June along with our District Championship in Kotka. To get fresh blood into our District, some changes were made in our executive committee. District Commodore. Secretary, Measurer, and one member were changed. We thank all these old members of the committee for their work, especially Commodore Hartti Nisonen, and welcome the new ones to do their best for our class in Finland.

Foreign affairs were handled by our Vice President who made a long journey to the ILCA World Meeting in Dallas, USA. Since the Europeans were in Helsinki this year, the meeting of European Districts wasn't so far away. We had three participants with our Italian and Swiss colleagues in that meeting.

The activity in fleets isn't too high here in Finland. In fact, we only have four active fleets namely Kemi, Tuusula, Kotka, and Helsinki. That is a question which needs ideas and work next year.

If the soul of the Lightning is the people, we could say that the body is the boat itself. Here in Finland the soul feels fine but the body suffers from deficiences. We got only one new boat number this year. Some more are expected for next season. These difficulties with new boats also influence in some extent the old ones too. Oval masts are fabricated in Finland but the specification of the black color makes us send the tubes to Sweden for surfacing. This odd-seeming detail surprises us because it makes the rig very expensive. Top sailors in our District use American sails because similar ones are not available here. This may be one of the reasons of sufferings in the body of Finnish Lightning.

Our District issues a magazine called Lightningviesti. We had three issues last year. Main work for that was done by Lauri Heikkila. Worth mentioning is that our reports on our big regattas were presented in the Finnish press. Also, PR was made for Lightnings on Finnish TV.

We had two boats attend the Worlds. Our District Championship was in Kotka with 36 participants. Europeans were in Helsinki with 45 boats. Jean-Claude DuPasquier from Switzerland took the trophies to Neuchatel. Our ranking-series was won by Kari Maenpaa.

For next summer, the Finland District is planning to give more to the soul of Lightning and to solve the problems with the body as well. We wait for the good sailing season of 1980.
