Oulu, the home town of the fleet 307 is a well-known center of sailboat racing. Markku Paloma sailed as 15th in the Finnish Championships. Oulu's most victorious Lightning sailor of '82 was, once again, Lasse Hammar with his boat, Rio-Rita IV, 13505. In the Finnish Championships arranged in Pori he sailed as the winner among 32 captains with the positions 1, 2, 1, 2. The crew of Rio-Rita IV included besides Lasse, the captain, his brother. Harry Hammar and Pentti Suorsa. By this feat Lasse Hammar became the Finnish Champion for the 6th time. The third Lightning sailor from Oulu, Ilmo Hassinen and his boat, Hattiwatti II, 13137 were on vacation last summer and did not participate in the races.

Although racing activity of the Oulu Lightnings is scarce, the standards are still high and up-to-date as to boats, equipments and achievements in racing. Here in Oulu we are eagerly waiting the following hot summer and its competitions.


