The first annual Michelob 'Great' Lake Ontario Lightning Classic Regatta was the highlight of Oswego's 1985 racing season.
Although most Lightning sailors know that Michelob has long been an enthusiastic supporter and sponsor of one design regattas, and even though most sailors have at one time or another enjoyed the thirst quenching characteristics of this superior beet, very few participants in this regatta realized just how hallowed the very water upon which they were sailing was.
