In the Poconos of north east Pennsylvania, Lake Wallenpaupack is known as the Big Lake. It is, in fact, the biggest lake in Pennsylvania, 13 miles long with 52 miles of shoreline, and it's a beautiful place to sail.

The lake is owned and controlled by the Pennsylvania Power & Light Co. and used as a power source. As a consequence, the level of the lake starts out at about 1200 feet elevation in the Spring and continues to descend as the summer progresses. Therefore, all docks are affoat and are periodically moved out as the water level is lowered. Our Lightnings are launched from a hoist on to a dolly which is on a railroad track and the dolly and boat are lowered into the lake by winch — and taken out by reversing the process.
