Fleet 481's most memorable event of 1989 occurred in June when Matt Fisher, with Lisa and Greg as crew, captured the Carolina Sailing Club Governor's Cup, marking the first time in the 32-year history of this event that it has been won by a Lightning. The Governor's Cup is a very special trophy awarded to the skipper who beats the most boats in a class during this weekend regatta which attracted more than 200 boats from a variety of classes.

The Fleet has 23 owner members, making it the largest fleet in the Southeastern District, and 23 crew members. We began the year by hosting a display at the local Boat Show, as part of our efforts to attract new members. We followed that with a couple educational/entertaining evenings. The "chalk talk" given by Tom Hudgens and assisted by Gordon Kellogg, both strong skippers, was particularly well received. Ched Proctor conducted an on-the-water clinic in March, as he returned victorious from the Southern Circuit. In June, the Fishers' conducted a racing clinic the day before the Governor's Cup Regatta.

Southeastern District participation was good. John Pelosi had the best fleet showing. with a sixth place in the district races for the year. The Fleet sponsored the Southeastern District Championships in Oriental. North Carolina. Repeating our 1987 performance, we once again received rave reviews for the two most important things under our control - the race committee and the socials. Forty knot winds cancelled the first day of the three-day regatta, in which twenty-one boats participated, but the wind the remaining two days cooperated much better,

Kent Mullikin was our Fleet Champion for the second year in a row. The race for Runner-Up was close, with Michael Rees edging out Billy Dixon by only two points. John Pelosi and Grant Wolslagel rounded out the top five.

Each October, the fleet sponsors the Borderline Regatta. Thirty-five boats raced in this year's event, with sailors, boatbuilders and sailmakers coming from as far away as New York.
