Cartoon character Pogo said it best. After a spy mission to the Pentagon he reported, "1 have seen the enemy and he is us."

In 1983 after a great summer, we decided on an affirmative action policy; we'd attract new Lightning sailors by promoting sailboat racing in Oswego (a virtual vacuum existed). During the next three summers we planned and executed "Open" sailing races for all comers. Those regattas are today pointed to as the spark that resulted in the formation of Oswego PHRF,

Tom Doran seemed more interested in his J-24.

IN PHRF the results were predictable; Doran was all-everything, McCloskey was runner-up all-everything. The other "fallen" fleet members? All sailed as crew aboard PHRF boats all summer.

Just when things looked the darkest, some positive things happened. Doran sailed every club race and easily won all three series. A guy named Tom Gregway bought Bill Pirillo's boat and put it back on the starting line with enthusiasm. Joe MeCloskey helped John Fitzgibbons get started and then John made most of the fleet races. Second year skipper Nick Canale made for a well rounded, competitive fleet.

At season's end John Jaskula, another new skipper, bought an idle Lightning and was out sailing late in October after most of the other boats were in storage. Lastly. Tirrell got off the fence and made a commitment to the fleet for 1992.

Amid all this turbulence there was some stability. For us it was the guys in 14034. Ed Taverni and his determined crew of Greg Auleta and Dale Scaringi were rewarded with a big payday at October's club awards banquet taking away Fleet Runner-Up honors. Ed's the last of our three fleet founders.

The Michelob Lightning Classic went off well once again. This year was the year we finally learned who is boss. We learned we have it, not the other way around.

I'm exhausted just telling you about it. But by golly there seems to be some energy left in the club after all. We're looking past 1991 toward tomorrow. One of the reasons for our optimism is the fact that several PHRF people are making noises about one-design sailing. Come on over and pay your dues boys.
