FLEET 35 CELEBRATES 50 YEARS

Like the cat with the instinct for survival and the fabled nine lives, Lightning Fleet 35 has survived the test of time because of the commitment and dedication of its true believers.

Originally chartered in the early 40's, Fleet 35 was able to withstand the interruption of World War II to make a strong comeback in post war years.

By the time Skipper Emeritus Willis McQueen joined the fleet in 1949, it was in its second life and had grown to eight boats — outgrowing the Corinthian Sailing Club facilities, Willis recalls building original davits #6 and #7 adjacent to the north gazebo to have a place for his new boat.

The fleet continued to prosper until the early 50's when mother nature dealt White Rock Lake a cruel blow and dried up the north end of the lake. Many of the fleet's skippers, tired of waiting for water to return to the lake, lowered their Lightnings from the high and dry davits onto trailers bound for the newly formed Dallas Corinthian Yacht Club on Lake Dallas.

Several devoted skippers remained loyal to Corinthian Sailing Club and White Rock and out waited the drouth. When the water returned in '56, the fleet began its third life with Willis McQueen, Milton Price, Harold Boss and Marshall Fagin taking up the challenge of rebuilding.

The late 50's and 60's were good to Fleet 35 with the fleet growing to an unprecedented 39 Lightnings in 1969.

The early 70's brought the winds of change, and the blue of a larger lake lured many of the fleet's skippers to the newly formed Rush Creek Yacht Club at Lake Ray Hubbard where Fleet 435 was formed.

Once again a small contingency of devoted Lightning skippers, Willis McQueen, Al Sather and John Waskom, III, held the fleet together to see better times.

In the 80's, guided by these seasoned veterans and survivors, Fleet 35 began yet another rebuilding and growth period — the fourth life.

The 90's have been a very prosperous period for Fleet 35 yielding a time of constant growth and improvement in the racing program. During 1991 the fleet experienced an unprecedented period of growth welcoming five new owners to the fleet closing out the '91 season with 19 boats, 15 of which are being actively sailed.

In recognition of the increase in membership and participation in Lightning sanctioned activities, the fleet was awarded the coveted "Nea| Steketee" Trophy for the "North American fleet who has been outstanding in furthering the purpose of the ILCA in promoting and developing racing."

It is reassuring that as the Lightning celebrates its 54th year as a class and Fleet 35 its 50th, no matter what Mother Nature holds in store for the future of White Rock waters, there are true believers among the members of Fleet 35 that are ready and willing to carry on the Lightning tradition for another five lives.

The worlds's largest Lightning Fleet had another great year of sailing on Cass Lake. Sean Fidler and Glen Gray both survived turning turtle, but Bonnie Nickels sailed consistently to claim the Club Championship. Sean Fidler finished second.

Thirty-four captains and crews entered our traditional Whitecap Regatta, held the first weekend after Labor Day. Terry Hutchinson, who is making a name for himself in the national arena in a variety of boats, came in from Traverse City to capture first place. Host club sailors Sean Fidler and Louie Nickels were second and third, while former North American Champion Colin Park settled for fourth. PYC member Charlie Hess was fifth and sixth through tenth place trophies were swept by hosts Bob Mathers, Jim McCoy, Diana Fernando, Joel Humphrey and Wally Smith, respectively.

Commodore Bob Shaw and Vice-Commodore Jim Swan provided strong leadership in another successful year for the Pontiac Yacht Club. We look forward to our continued strong presence in Lightning affairs. If you're in the area, we invite you to stop in and race or crew with our competitive membership.
