The season of '95 will be remembered for the successful restructuring of our racing schedule and individual excellence. The Year 1995 was full of work for the Finland District and for the Helsinki Fleet. All the available class members were needed to assist the organization of the World Championships at Kuopio and European and District Championships at Helsinki. Many old faces were seen again on the shore, hopefully sometime also on the sea. The active boats in Fleet 166 were the Aromaa family's Masi and Gamma sailed by Olli Muroke, Erkki Lempiäinen and Tuomas Pihkala. The crews of both boats had been concentrating on the World Championships. Masi had qualified already on the previous year, but Gamma had to try to qualify from the District Championships. Our District Commodore, Lauri Hemming, sold his boat Minmax to Lahti, but neither he nor the boat retired from the racing.

Our season began traditionally with the On the Rocks Regatta, also the first ranking regatta, in the middle of May at Lake Tuusulanjärvi. This year we had very light winds on Saturday and a heavy storm on Sunday. Though the race committee decided to race on Sunday, this was soon abandoned. No races were sailed on Sunday, but the boats already on the lake had difficulties getting back. Leo Korhonen from Tuusulanjärvi fleet won for the third time in a row. Gamma was very fast and was second overall, Only a disqualification after a protest hearing separated them for the Championship. The Lähteinen family were back again with new mast and sails. They sailed also fast and finished third overall. Our fleet's second boat, Masi from the host club. was seventh.

The next ranking regatta was sailed at Tampere two weeks later. Good weather and a good regatta, and the last chance to practice for the big events. Masi was fourth and Gamma eighth. After this regatta it was time to prepare for the European and World Championships, a two-week period full of racing, travelling and good times. The Europeans were in the last week of June outside Helsinki. Twenty-three boats from five countries were present. The arranging club, HSK, is perhaps the most capable race organizer in Finland. The common wind on a clear and warm day is a 8-10 m/s SW in the afternoon, which makes the race area in less than one hour quite choppy. The reason is that the mass of buildings of the city get warmer and create a strong local wind system. Otherwise the passing weather fronts may result in any wind direction and speed. This year we had good weather and good winds, which made the race enjoyable and very interesting. The first day was sailed in light winds (or in no wind), for the other days we had 7-11 m/s westerly winds and choppy sea. The results show, that for the first 5-6 boats the race was very even. The only boats who won more than one race were the winner Bram Palm and the World Champion Tito Gonzalez. Had Tito been little less greedy in the first two races (two PMS) he would have probably won the Europeans also. Bram Palm won, Paul Wurtzebach was second and the talented young Italian Mario Noto third. Our fleet's Gamma was ninth and Masi eleventh.


After the Europeans a rapid travel up to Kuopio, boat checks, practice races and the highlight of the season, the Worlds. The races gained a lot of publicity in newspapers, television news and even in Eurosport sports channel. The race area at Kallavesi is small, just outside the town, surrounded by hills and mostly tricky. The weather was quite good except the rainy Tuesday and stormy Wednesday, which was recorded as the heaviest storm last summer. The races were full of incidents, which made for the headlines; disqualification of Mario Noto in first race, capsize of Tito when leading the second race. and the storm. Out of the 35 boats, twelve did not finish in the first race and eight in the second race. Four boats were not able to start in the second race, most of them due to broken masts. Fortunately, only material damages happened; broken masts, booms, boomvangs etc. Perhaps the campaign flag which was tied on the backstays was a good omen, "Paras Aryhmä pysyy pinnalla* (The best A-class stays afloat.)

Already after the Europeans a lot of Finnish sailors thought that Tito Gonzalez will be the next World Champion; there in Helsinki he was fastest in four races, but was disqualified in two. In Kuopio he sailed two first places and two second places

and secured the Championship already before the last race, showing clearly that he is a true Champion. The Allens were his strongest opponents, Bill Faude and Steve Hayden being next closest. Urs Wyler from Switzerland was the only European, who managed to sail in the top ten. Our fleet's *Gamma* was 15. and *Masi* 17., both Olli and Kimmo skippered their first Worlds.

The last regattas after the big events were sailed on lakes. The most active ten boats had still enough interest to race. The Tampere regatta was in the middle of August and Jyväskylä in the first week of September. Ten boats were present in both races, *Masi* in both races but *Gamma* in neither. The last race was a match between Leo Korhonen and Kimmo Aromaa for the first place in our Districts ranking series. Leo won the last regatta and thus also the ranking series. *Masi* was second again and *Gamma* was fifth, a total of 23 boats got a ranking series result. Some match-racing was also tried in August at Helsinki, also this year four boats participated. The future of Lightning Class in Finland may depend much on this kind of racing. The Lightning is fast and lively but stable, so it suits well for match-racing.

For a few years we have been concentrating only for the big events of this year. Therefore our training and other class activities have been mostly for the top sailors. The following year is dedicated for the common sailor and we are trying to encourage new sailors to select our class and to draw former active sailors back. . . .Jari Aromaa
