Kaudella 1997 Helsingin laivueella ei juurikaan ollut toimintaa. Helsingin laivueen veneet kilpailivat lähinnä match-race kisoissa Suomen Mestaruuksien lisäksi. Laivueen venekanta pieneni taas kerran Olli Murokkeen ja kumppaneiden myydessä Gammansa Kemiin. Helsingin laivueen paras menestys tuli Suomen Mestaruuskilpailuista Kimmo Aromaan saadessa hopeaa ja laivueen voittaessa joukkuemestaruuden.

Kuluneen kauden päätapahtuma oli Suomen Mestaruuskilpailut Valkeakosken Purjehtijoiden järjestämänä. Ajankohta oli varsin myöhäinen, elokuun puolivälissä, mikä saattoi pudottaa osallistujien määrää. Tänä vuonna Mallasvesi tarjosi kilpailijoille kaikkea mahdollista säätä. Kahden voimakkaan säärintaman ylittäessä Suomea, toisen kisapaikan pohjois- ja toisen eteläpuolelta, tuulta oli ensin liikaa, sitten riittävästi, ja lopulta ei ollenkaan. Perjantaina vesillelähtöä lykättiin aina iltaan saakka ja päivän ainoa lähtö oli kello 19.00. Lauantaina otettiin aikataulua kiinni ja ajettiin kolme lähtöä keskituulissa. Sunnuntaina taas odoteltiin vesillä tuulen viriämistä, joka sitten alkoikin vähän ennen viimeistä mahdollista ajankohtaa. Viideskin lähtö saatiin siten ajettua.

Olli Muroke oli myynyt viime vuoden mestariveneensä Gamman Kemiin, ja uuden kipparinsa Kari Huuskon ajamana vene aloitti SM-kilpailut taas hyvin voittaen kaksi ensimmäistä lähtöä. Olli Muroke oli lainannut uudehkon Lightboats-veneen ja aloitti varsin vahvasti kuten myös paikkakunnan värien puolustaja Järvisten Red Snapper. Masi V kärsi selvästi harjoituksen puutteesta ajaen pari huonoa lähtöä ennen kuin pääsi vauhtiin mukaan. Tuusulan Olli Lähteinen Shark-veneellään ajoi hyvin, mutta sortui ensimmäisessä lähdössä kulkuoikeusrikkomukseen maalilinjalla, eikä huomannut korjata virhettään. Tuloksena oli siten hylkäys. Lauantaina iltapäivän lähdöissä Gamma alkoi hieman hiipua, kun taas Masi ja Shark alkoivat vertyä. Red Snapper jatkoi tasaista sarjaansa. Sunnuntaiaamuna mitaleita ei vielä oltu jaettu, Gammakin saattoi vielä hävitä lähes varman mestaruutensa. Sunnuntaina tuuli olikin

sitten olematon ja oli selvää, että vain yksi lähtö, jos sitäkään saataisiin ajettua. Tuloksiin laskettaisiin siten kaikkien lähtöjen pisteet, joissa Masilla painoi 8. sija ja Sharkilla diskaus. Lopulta yksi lähtö saatiinkin ajettua, ja siinä Masi voitti, Gamma oli toinen ja Red Snapper kolmas. Suomen Mestari tuli pitkästä aikaa Tuusulan tai Helsingin ulkopuolelta. Kari Huusko ajoi ensimmäistä vuottaan Lightningia ja korjasi potin viemällä myös ranking- mestaruuden. Viime vuoden kakkonen Masi V oli taas toinen ja Valkeakosken Red Snappersai ensimmäiset mitalinsa kotikisoissaan.

Historiallisista syistä laivue 166 jatkaa vielä aktiivisten joukossa, mutta yleisesti ottaen Helsingin laivueen toiminta on hiipumassa. ILCA:n jäsenmaksukorotus saattaa pienentää jäsenmäärää entisestään, eikä yhdelle tai kahdelle veneelle kannattane enää laivue-

toimintaa ylläpitää.

The Year 1997 showed very little activity for the Helsinki Fleet. Our boats raced mainly in match races besides the District Championships. The number of boats decreased again, when Olli Muroke sold his Gamma to Kemi. The best results of our Fleet were second place in District Championships by Kimmo Aromaa and first place in District team race.

The main event of this year were the District Championships. The event took place quite late in the season, in the middle of August, which could have caused the unusually low number of participants. This year the Lake Mallasvesi offered almost every kind of weather. Two strong weather front were crossing Finland, one north and one south to the race area. This resulted first in too heavy weather, on the next day in medium air and on the final day in almost dead calm. On Friday the races were postponed until 19.00 hours waiting for winds to drop. On Saturday three races were sailed to get back to the time schedule and on Sunday the sailors waited almost until the last minute, before some wind appeared and the fifth race could be sailed.

Olli Muroke had sold his previous year champion boat Gamma to Kemi and with the new owner Kari Huusko the boat began with overwhelming speed and won first two races. Olli had borrowed a quite new Lightboats boat and together with the host club boat Red Snapper sailed well. Kimmo Aromaa with Masi V sailed first two poor races before getting back the routine. Olli Lähteinen from Tuusula sailed also well with the boat Shark, but in the first race he made a right-of-way mistake on the finishing line and did not correct it. He was thus disqualified. On Saturday afternoon races Gamma did not sail as well, whereas Masi and Shark were getting better. Red Snapper continued with a even series. On Sunday morning, with two races left, the winners were not yet certain. Even Gamma could lose its almost certain first place. The wind was almost non-existent and so only one or no races would be sailed that day. The results of all races would be calculated in the final score, Masi having an eight place and Shark a DSQ. Finally one race was sailed, and in that one Masi won, Gamma was second and Red Snapper third. The District Champion was after many years found from outside Helsinki and Tuusula area. Kari Huusko sailed his first year in Lightning and besides the District Championship he won also the District ranking series. The previous year runner-up Masi was second also this year and host club Red Snapper got their first Championship medals by placing third.

Due to historical reasons the Fleet 166 continues to be on the active list, but generally the activity in the fleet is decreasing. The increase of dues will probably decrease the number of members further. It is doubtful that organizing events for one or two boats will have any sense or effect on Lightning class activity.

Shreveport Fleet 175 celebrates its fiftieth anniversary this year. Our fleet sails on Cross Lake which is partially the city limits of Shreveport. The bed of the lake was dammed up as a joint project by the city of Shreveport waterworks department and the Kansas City Southern Railroad in 1920 to form the present lake which extends about twelve miles in the direction of the Texas line. Sailing began immediately as those in the vicinity now had a place to float their craft and the sport became organized shortly thereafter with the chartering of the Shreveport Boat Club (now Shreveport Yacht Club) in 1926. In 1947 Fleet 175 was chartered and our Lightning family has been a close one since that time. I say "our" because my parents joined very shortly thereafter with the purchase of 3477. After having been introduced to the Lightning at Pass Christian, Mississippi, they were captivated both by sailing and the Lightning as a pleasure boat and racing craft, not to mention the fact that they had a few friends in the fleet. The camaraderie is something that has continued throughout these years, and throughout my lifetime I have maintained close ties with former Lightning sailors.

Fleet 175 and Shreveport Yacht Club lost one of our most ardent sailors with the sudden death of Charles O. Hardey. Chuck and his wife Ray had taken up sailing in the early 1940's when he was in law school at Tulane. When they moved to Shreveport in 1947 they began sailing a Lightning. With the help of local boatbuilder Cecil Plants they built Melody and Solo and sailed Lightnings off and on throughout their sailing career. Chuck had in recent years purchased a local Lightning just for the purpose of building up our fleet. 
