Antero and Erkki even took time to take part in a warm-up regatta in Rochester before the main event in Montreal. The only "fully Finnish" team ended-up placing in 53rd place. Overall a good finish, considering that it was their first regatta together this season.

Two active Fleet 456 crews travelled to northern Finland for the third ranking series regatta in Kemi at the end of July. Olli Lähteinen and crew actually arrived in Kemi straight from the European Championships in Athens, Greece.
