


Dan Moriarty and crew at the Bay Series of the CA Circuit,





The Michigan District started it's season in May. We had lighter than average wins and turnout. Low turnout appeared to have many reasons,





The family Graf is getting each year greater! Long life for Elvira and felicitations to Margrit and Peter.


Next year I'm sure that we will see more activity and I hope that a minimum of five crews will participate at the Europeans and Worlds in Marsala.
