

He was the initiator of the Europeans championship 1964 and 1980 in Neuchâtel. He was also active in the organization of the World Youth championship in 1994.

After the Second World War, Claude knocked about the world and was in Peru in the year 1948 and spent three years in Canada at the beginning in Ontario and in 1952 in Montreal.


During his working life as ship chandler in Neuchätel, Claude has had a lot of contacts with the professionals of the Lightning Class in the States (Bill Shore, Tom Allen, Harkens, etc) and in the seventies his son Laurent was working two years in the sail factory of Bill Shore.

As Lightning sailor Claude was active since 1954 till the end of his life. In 1960 he was Swiss Champion and European Runner-up. A second time Swiss Champion in 1964 and Italian Champion in 1976. Claude was also winner of the Winter European Championship of Marsala in Sicilia in the year 1978.

He sailed his last European Championship in 1999 and closed his international activity at the 2nd Europeans Masters Championship in Neuchätel the same year.

Claude was also active in the Class administration as vicepresident, commodore and was life member of the Class.

A faithful friend has let go... too early, Lightning sailors around the world will miss Claude.
