During the sailing season 2003 the Helsinki Fleet 166 continued to work in close co-operation with the Tuusulan-järvi fleet 456. The next regatta was District Championships in Oulu. This year we had only 14 boats, the schedule was three days and nine races with upwind-downwind courses. On the first day Masi V was fast scoring 1-1-1, followed by Niko Lappalainen from Tuusula and Markku Paloma from Oulu. On the second day Masi V was not so overwhelming. Kimmo sailed 2-3-6 while Samppa Salminen sailed good and moved to second place. The last day became a thriller. After the first six races Kimmo had 14 points and Samppa 21 points. Samppa sailed good races and Kimmos lead was shrinking. In the last race Samppa won, but Kimmo managed to rise to fifth place. This gave Masi V their second District championship.

The next race in Tampere was sailed again with strong winds on Saturday and light winds on Sunday. Kimmo was still hungry for victories and won. In Lohja the winds were rather heavy, and a new winner was found, Matti Leppänen from Tuusula. Kimmo was second. The last ranking regatta was sailed in Jyväskylä. 


