There were at least three very good things about 2004 on Squam Lake. The first was the number of boats racing. With the Cunningham's taking the big prize, other awards went to Christian Whatley for the July Series, and to the Welles-Gertz boat (also using three different skippers) for the August series, the long distance "around the lake" race, and the Closson trophy for the last three races of the season.



The youth movement is alive at Squam Lake. Fleet 332 season champions John Cunningham (15), Nadine Cunningham (13), and Art Cunningham (old man) move #9829 to windward. All three skippered at least one race this year and their combined efforts took home the Howdy Wood trophy.

Special awards included the Yellow Bucket for exceptional seamanship to Dan Egan for climbing the mast to retrieve a wandering spinnaker halyard and the Diamond Ledge award for a feat of navigation to Dave Closson for finding the bottom of the lake with his centerboard.

Because the annual regatta is almost always won by a visiting boat, Wally Ackley donated a perpetual trophy this year for the best finish in the event by a Squam boat. Dwight Gertz and old college team mate Harry Mattison broke this jinx (presaging perhaps a similar accomplishment by the Red Sox) when they actually won the regatta, although the new award will undoubtedly be very much appreciated in years to come when things return to form.

Other accomplishments, on and off the water, were too numerous to mention in their entirety but special notice must be made of Wally Ackley's return to the fray this summer after sustaining a detached retina last year. He made it official by promptly winning a race. On the water, but using a different form of motive power, Bob Sengstaken rowed his single scull to a top ten finish in his age group at the Head of the Charles, one of the largest rowing regattas in the World. Meanwhile, the fleet further proved the diversity of its talents as Will Abbott became the Executive Director of Mount Washington Observatory, where intrepid meteorologists maintain their watch more than a mile above Squam Lake and regularly endure the "worst weather in America." With friends this interesting, the conversation after sailing is always good.

We elected PJ Blankenhorn as our new Fleet Captain for 2005 and we look forward to another year on "Golden Pond."

Planning is well underway for another really great season of Lightning sailing in the year 2005. Jim DeCesare, a second generation Lightning sailor, is Commodore of BLYC in 2005, so that should bode well for sailing at BLYC. As we write this, we have not yet heard of our plans for a midwinter Fleet meeting, but it has been held for all these many years and will be scheduled again to be held in early 2005, perhaps in Princeton or Philadelphia.

It has been a huge year of change for fleet 365 at Catawba Yacht Club. Our numbers have dwindled significantly as two of our members left the class and three others remain very inactive. And so, the 2004 fleet report is really the story of one dedicated team of fleet 365 racers, Ron Wright, John Holmes and Tom Martin, otherwise known as "Team Catawba".

The 2004 Lightning season began with our first trip to a national regatta - the Southern Open in Savannah. It was awesome to find ourselves in the company of the best Lightning sailors in the world. To say we were competitive would be a lie! But we had a great time and we did have some good moments on the water. We also kept our record intact of avoiding the cellar in any regatta!

The district traveling series began at Catawba Yacht Club in April with the kick-off regatta for the Southeastern Lightning District - the Cottonwood Regatta. Pete Marriott won the event. But Team Catawba made some noise by winning their first district level Lightning race in the second race of the first day.

With a fourth place finish at CYC under our belts, we turned to Lake Norman and the Voodoo Regatta. The wind would not cooperate on Saturday, But Sunday served up enough for four races. We simply couldn't get it going in races 1 and 2 and finished in the basement both times. But something kicked in and we rallied for a 3 and 6 to finish in seventh overall.

From Norman we traveled to Wrightsville for the district championships. We arrived on Friday and were treated to a rare set of circumstances. Greg Fisher was in town to host a clinic and the wind was blowing off the chain. We took to the channel in our

From Wrightsville we turned to Beaufort and the Low-Country Regatta. Debbie Baldridge would sail middle for us as Tom had a schedule conflict. An excerpt from Ron's regatta report summed up the first day:

"Pinch me John, this can't be real! Well, we were feeling pretty good. [We had a 3 and 1 in the first two races.] In race three, I went back to a port start and lo and behold, we were off at the gun in clear air again. And again, we put it all together, this time for a deuce. Terry [Tyner] did not fair as well, finishing fourth. For the first time in my young sailing career, I found myself contemplating math. 3+1+2=6. We, by golly, were in first place. Tyner was one point behind. Pinch me John, this can't be real. But real it was."

"That night, we drove back to the club for the party. Mother nature continued to bless us as she served up a cooling 6-8 knot breeze into the evening. The downshot was it too much for the noseeums. It was one of those rare combinations of great food, great music, great weather, and great friends. You just didn't want it to end. We ate low-country boil. We sat on the deck and listened to a great blues band. We walked out on the launch pier and watched the lights up and down the river. It was the best regatta party I have ever attended."

Of course, reality returned on Sunday as we struggled in light air to finish third overall. But for one brief evening, Team Catawba was in first. And it was a feeling like none we had ever experienced.

For 2004, the Lansing Sailing Club's Fleet 387 opted for a new summer series. In addition to the traditional, full season calendar of three races every Sunday, a new "half-season series" was instituted where only selected Sundays would count towards the fleet championship. The half-season dates avoided nearby district regattas, so that skippers could compete both away and at home with no disadvantage.

Pat Dolan, sailing Wind Dancer, repeated as fleet champion. Pat skippered in 65 of the 75 races, with crews Gil Chesbro and Susanna Tellschow making guest appearances. It was very rare to not find Wind Dancer sailing somewhere on a weekend. Wind Dancer was dominant on the race course, sailing in more races than any other boat and winning the majority of them. Pat also sailed at the Blue Nose and at Pontiac's regattas. Bob Miller, Gary Marx, and Stacy Kotecki were also regular crew. Wind Dancer also took home top honors for the half-season series championship.

For the third year in a row, Mike Moody skippered Moody's Booty to the runner-up position in both the full and half-season championships. Mike competed in 53 races, most often with Lisa Winters and Ken Knight. Mike also sailed at Pontiac and Wawasee this season.

Blaine Severin continues to improve, placing UFP third - their

highest season finish ever - in the full season and fourth in the half season. Blaine has been getting a lot of tiller time on the Michigan District circuit, and the results have paid off. Tom Diets and Julie Pierce were the crew in most of UFP's 43 races.

Neil Harrison got out on the water more in 2004, joined by longtime crew Alana Harvey. John Quensen was a new crew for this season, and helped power the team to fourth in the full season (46 races) and fifth in the full season.

John LeFevre, sailing his newly acquired Sail Fevre, picked up fifth position in the full season with 43 races, and ninth in the half-season. Leif Alton was John's regular crew. Sail Fevre was one of four LSC boats at the Pontiac Whitecap this year.

Claiming sixth in the full season and seventh in the half season is Merrick Hürlbutt. Merrick has also steadily improved, and this season showed increasing confidence in downwind spinnaker sailing in heavy conditions. Merrick was joined by Scott Watkins and Adrian Tuttle.

The half-season championship counts roughly fifty percent of the scheduled races. Thirty six races were sailed, with the best 21 counting. The results were similar to the full season, the exception being George Siegle, sailing Fins with Ann Siegle and Laura Harvey. Fins missed qualifying for the full season but placed third in the half season. The team also competed in the Tawas Bay regatta.

Other notable finishers include Larry Koster, sailing Shibumi to 6th place, Terry Kleiman in 8th place, Jim Fletcher sailing Bananas to 10th, Ron Marshall in 11th, and Don Baron in 12th place. See our photo spread for the full results.

The 2005 Tune Up Regatta was held on May 22, and unlike in years past, it was a heavy air affair. The wind continued to build through the morning, and spiked after a lunch of chili and cornbread at the club. Several boats retired, due to injuries, fatigue or breakdowns. The points leaders and most of the LSC boats returned to the water for the last two races. Going into the final race, there was still quite a battle. The typically shifty winds on Lake Lansing can easily drop a boat from first to worst, especially with the long windward leeward courses set by the RC. Tom Klaban was in the lead with 10 points followed by George Siegle in Fins with 14 and Mike Moody in Moody's Booty with 17. With a throwout in play, it was down to one race. At the final turn, Fins had a good lead on Klaban and Moody's Booty. Klaban and Siegle took the right side of the course, and Moody went left, as did the remaining boats. Without enough boats between Fins and Klaban for the overall win, Siegle crossed to the left to cover the fleet. Fins got nipped at the line by Klaban but preserved the cover, guaranteeing the a second place finish, "Ye Olde Silver Platter" for being the top LSC boat, and the MSU Alumni Cup for top boat skippered by an MSU grad. Moody's Booty was a strong third, followed by the LSC's Terry Kleiman and Pat Dolan. See our photo spread for full results.

Fleet 387 has several special awards. The Corinthian Award honors a skipper who contributes to the health and growth of the fleet though racing, teaching and sportsmanship, John LeFevre is our 2005 winner. Crew-of-the-Year honors go to Bob Miller, who had a strong season in Wind Dancer. Rookie Crew of the Year goes to Susanna Tellschow, who was very active in racing. The "Wet Bottom Award" for the crew who goes all out for their skipper was renamed the "Jane Marshall Sailing Award," for its 2004 recipient, Jane Marshall.




