On the final beat Michael crossed a few of us with one of the few lefties of the weekend to save his points and capture the George Sipel trophy on tie-breaker with the Allens.

The "northern circuit" was also lightly attended. Tawas drew a small but competitive fleet, with Jim Allen and Ernie Dieball schooling the faithful from Fleet 216 in ideal boatspeed conditions. Charlie Hess was just as fast on our other Great Lake but was undone by an overstressed gooseneck and awarded only style points for best comeback after a quick Sunday morning repair from borrowed parts. The party at the Princings was a little more subdued, now that Willie has assumed some role model responsibility for his young daughter.

The Race Committee was constantly working to adjust the course to constant wind changes. A good time was had by all, and I would like to thank John Heagy and the Michigan Class for coming to Macatawa. We are working toward rebuilding the Fleet, and the Districts were a major contribution for members to see how much fun can be had in a Lightning and, more importantly, the great people that the Class attracts.

The world's largest Lightning Fleet, Pontiac Yacht Club, saw 57 races completed of the 65 scheduled for the Spring, Summer and Fall, Sunday and Wednesday Series. Five cancelled races were early in the season in the Spring Sunday and Wednesday Series, with two in the Summer Sunday Series and just one in the Fall Wednesday series. Most of the races were sailed in moderate and light winds, with a few gustier days interspersed to keep club members and their crews on watch. More skippers than in past years made unexpected capsize recoveries on the gustier days, including Dick Beaubien, Norm Burns, Ed Dziuba, Eric Heller, Matt Morrin and Andy Monique.

The Spring Sunday Series had twenty-four skippers sailing one or more races with fifteen qualifying for the series, which was five more than number of participants from the year before. The Spring Wednesday Series had thirty-three skippers sailing, with eighteen sailing enough races to qualify, which was four more than the year before. The Summer Sunday Series saw thirty Lightnings being sailed with twelve skippers qualifying for the series that equaled the number of qualifiers in the previous year. The Summer Wednesday Series had thirty-nine skippers sailing one or more races with fourteen qualifying. The Fall Sunday Series saw twenty-eight entries scoring points, while thirty skippers continued to sail in the Fall Wednesday Series. The Sunday Series had more members participating, while the Wednesday Series remained constant from Spring to Fall with the number of members competing throughout the year.

The Memorial Day Regatta had eighteen skippers and crews sailing in the first mini-regatta of the year. Tom Klaban won with Mike Roualet and Mike Hecker following in second and third. The Club Championship in July only had five participants on the water sailing in the first day's racing this year, with Ed Dzuiba winning all three races on Saturday and then going on to finish the remaining races on Sunday in first place. Mike Welch finished as the runner-up. The Fourth of July Regatta was not held due to the holiday and weekend not being on concurrent days. The Labor Day Regatta saw twelve skippers sailing the scheduled races of the holiday weekend. Tom Klaban won, followed by Sean Fidler as the runner-up and Mike Hecker in third place.

The Commodore's Challenge Wednesday evening race night saw Brian Klaban winning the only race to get under way as the wind subsided as the evening progressed.

Mike Hecker sailed forty-two races during the three series of Sunday and Wednesday races this year. An additional group of three skippers also sailed over forty races each at PYC this year, including Norm Burns, Dick Beaubien and Mark Kramer. 

Lightning Fleet 387 is pleased to report that our 2006 participation was the highest in several years, with nine skippers qualifying for the full season. This can be attributed to the active recruitment of sailors by our club management. As many of our Lightning skippers and crew are also Laser and Sunfish racers, junior training and recruitment occurs in all our fleets. Our club continued to host several crew training courses. The Lightning Fleet is the recipient of the "racing spirit" generated at our club.

The Lansing Sailing Club Lightning Fleet sailed a "Dual" Season during 2006 to encourage participation. The "Full-Season" was comprised of 61 races held on 21 Sundays between May and October. Scores were based on the individual skipper's best 24 (40%) scores, with 40% participation needed to qualify. The "Half-Season" was based on a predetermined schedule of 16 race-days (33 races) during the season. The best 21 scores were used to calculate the individual results. No minimum participation was required.

Our 41st Annual Tune-Up Regatta was held on May 20th. We continue to be one of the first regattas in the Michigan District regatta season, and hold a one day (Saturday) venue that attracts several skippers for purpose of setting up for an early tune-up. Second place went to Chris Jacobson (Bay City Yacht Club) while third place went to Blaine Severin (Lansing Sailing Club). A total of nine boats raced in the 2006 regatta.

The honored skippers were; Pat Dolan (Fleet Champion), Jim Fletcher (Corinthian Trophy for sportsmanship), Merrick Hurlbutt (Challenger Award for competitiveness), Larry Koster (Most Improved Season), Johnathon Ahlbrand (Rookie Skipper) and Susanna Tellschow (WOW! astronomical improvement). Crew awards went to; Gil Chesboro (Crew of the Year), Michael-Salomen Jost (Rookie of the Year) and Alanna Harvey (Jane Marshall Wet Bottom Award for stalwart crew).


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


