



For the second year in a row, Bob Harkrider ran the table in the Southeastern District, winning the Traveling Series and the District Championship. Terry Tyner opened the 2006 season with a win at the Lake Murray Sailfest on his home waters in Columbia, South Carolina. Terry duplicated the win a few weeks later at the VooDoo Regatta on Lake Norman.

On June 3, we turned to our District Championships at Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina. The competition was fierce. In Race1 there was rain, Race 2 brought 20-knot breezes, and the day ended with dying breezes in Race 4. Three skippers won races, including Pierce Barden, Bob Harkrider, and John Sawyer. Barden won the day with a low score of eight points. On Sunday, Bob sailed 1-2 while Avis Bridgers won the final race. With a throw-out in effect, Harkrider won the championship with a low score of eight.

When September arrived, we went back to the lakes. John Sawyer joined Bob Harkrider and Terry Tyner as the third skipper to win a traveling regatta, taking first at the Augusta Invitational. Two weeks later, he duplicated the result with a win at Waccamaw. In Atlanta, Marcus Moehlman, new to the District this year, won first place, becoming the fourth skipper to win a series event. That left the Borderline regatta. The Wake Fleet hosts a great October regatta, and the Borderline annually attracts national caliber sailors. Tom Allen, Jr. won the regatta, with Tom Hissam, Pierce Barden, Bob Harkrider, and Terry Tyner going 2-3-4-5. When the season tabulations were in, Bob Harkrider won the traveling series by nearly a full point over Terry Tyner.

Season kudos also have to go to John Pelosi. John sailed more regattas than any other skipper (six). He placed top three in four regattas and earned a solid third place finish on the season.

On the national scene, Bob Harkrider (7), Pierce Barden (13), and Avis Bridgers (15) all raced for the President's Cup at San Diego. Avis finished third in the Women's NAs. Pierce raced the ACCs (36). Lenny Krawcheck (11), Terry Tyner (29) and Pam Barron (38) raced Savannah. Pam also had a great finish at the Bluenose. 2006 has been a status-quo year for Fleet 481. We finished this season having neither gained nor lost average participation in our local regattas. For this season, I list eleven "active" Lightning sailors; however, three of these skippers chose only to serve as crew this year, and two skippers participated in only one regatta for the season. So to be most realistic, we currently have six active Lightnings in the fleet.

But this is not bad news for Fleet 481. There is renewing interest and energy, and 2007 promises to be a stronger year for Fleet participation. Dale Hedin is a new boat owner who recently refurbished his boat in time to participate in our Fleet-sponsored "Borderline Regatta." We are looking forward to Dale's participation next season. Alan Hawkes is becoming increasingly active, and we have two new Lightning owners in the area, Tripp Foster and Ambrose Stafford. They have not yet purchased their boats but will hopefully be joining us on the water next season.

Lack of love for sailing the Lightning is never a reason given for lack of participation. Nor is lack of crew. We have a nice supply of capable Lightning crew that participate with several fleets comprising the Carolina Sailing Club. Rather, it is the usual "pressures of life" that seem to be the main culprit. Alan Krauss has family commitments that presently consume his free time, although we look forward to his return to activity in a few years. Michael Rees, as a managing physician, has his sailing time limited by his professional demands but continues to be active with the club. Charles Moore has often sailed with his daughters who have less time for sailing these days (we are going to find Chuck some crew!). It was Charles,

in fact, in a recent conversation, that put his finger on one of the biggest participation challenges facing our fleet. We sail "off the ramps" and do not have a permanent physical club or marina. This means we set-up and tear down for each and every regatta, and this takes extra time for those that are time challenged. Personally, I really disliked this when I started sailing Lightnings in 2005. Now, I'm OK with it—practice makes perfect!

Presently, Wake 481 participation is sustained primarily by six skippers: Pelosi, Puckett, Bridgers, Chaplinsky, Graves and Hawkes. Bob Graves deserves special mention in our Fleet because he travels all the way down from the Williamsburg, Virginia area to participate in our Kerr Lake events. Pelosi and Bridgers, and to a lesser extent Puckett, have carried the Wake 481 flag around the Southeastern Lightning District (SELD). Puckett will be more active in the district in '07 ('06 saw his district season run aground with both of his primary crew developing back injuries that were not sailing related).

Within the SELD, John Pelosi is our Fleet champ. He finished third overall in 2006, missing second place by the narrowest of margins. Avis and Henry Bridgers also campaigned across the southeast, but their '06 season was focused on getting to the NAs in San Diego—a long way to drive from North Carolina! And we cannot report without tipping our hat to our Kerr Lake Series Champion, John Chaplinsky.

For those Lightning sailors out there who may be considering a move to the Raleigh-Durham-Chapel Hill area (the "Triangle area" as it is said around here), we offer a variety of racing opportunities:

- Kerr Lake Championship Series—one weekend per month, April through October
- Jordan Lake Informal Series—one Sunday per month, year 'round sailing!
- Governor's Cup Regatta—open invitational in June with a LI one-de sign start
- Edenton Bay Challenge—held mid-summer on the Albemarle Sound
- The Borderline Regatta—Lightning One-Design each October on Kerr Lake


The Southeastern Lightning District Championships were hosted by Fleet 511 the first weekend in June, with thirteen boats participating. On Friday night, John and Becky Sawyer hosted a cookout at their new home, giving everyone a chance to socialize before setting off for a weekend of competitive racing and challenging conditions. Saturday's racing was accompanied with lots of wind, big waves and a few moments of wondering why you were out there in the first place. Racing was followed by a catered dinner at the club and the SE District Annual Meeting where events for the 2007 season were discussed. We awoke Sunday to very light winds and no waves, which forced the Race Committee to postpone the racing until the wind increased. Still, we were able to get in two races on Sunday, and the winner wasn't decided until the last race, when Bob Harkrider from Augusta, Georgia, came from behind on the last downwind leg and won the District Championships. Pierce Barden finished second, and three Fleet 511 boats tied for fifth, with John Sawyer winning the tie breaker over Steve Johnston and Jay Taylor.

We had two boats qualify for the SELD traveling series, with John Sawyer finishing fourth and Richard Waldkirch finishing in fifth place overall. The Fleet was also represented at larger regattas, with Waldkirch attending the Deep South in Savannah, Dave Pyle and Barden attending the Potomac Cup in Virginia, Barden traveling to New Jersey for ACCs, and then to San Diego for North Americans. Fleet 511 was represented very well at the Borderline, with seven boats competing, consisting of Tom Hissam, Barden, Sawyer, Taylor, Waldirch, Pyle, and Bob Cowen.

We sail on White Rock Lake in Dallas. Seven boats signed up to sail in this year's Texas District Championship. We had two boats travel from outside the District to help us have a good regatta. The Texas District is in the process of rebuilding, with a combination of new sailors and some experienced sailors taking the sport back up again.

The first race was started in an easterly breeze of around ten knots. The boats that held left on the first beat lead at the first windward mark. As the leaders approached the windward mark, a shift to the right meant an immediate gybe set for the run. The middle paid off on the second beat. The wind died as the leaders sailed the second run. The second beat had spread the Fleet out, but as the wind filled back in, the Fleet bunched up again resulting in nail-biting, overlapped finishes.

The wind died again, and we didn't get any more racing in on Saturday. On Sunday morning we had a steady ten to twelve out of the south. We got three good races in. The second race started in a right phase, but with the mark tucked in under the shore. It paid to hold on starboard to the left shore. The second beat played out the same way, resulting in a lead change.

In the third and fourth races, the beats demanded playing the shifts up the middle. Downwind, it seemed to pay off to sail deep along the left, which was important because we had downwind finishes on Sunday morning.

White Rock is a small inland lake with no wave action, so clear air and boat speed were critical. The leaders consistently had the best speed. In the end, we had some good racing, and Texas will send at least two boats to San Diego. See you there!!

The 2006 sailing season is now coming to a close. We had more boats at the Texas Districts than we have had in many years, and for the first time in ten years, we sent more than one boat to the North Americans. Clarke Newman, after a multi-decade hiatus, won the Texas Districts in June with Deanna Newman and Kelson Elam as crew. Newman last attended the NAs in 1979, and the San Diego NAs was the first out-of-town regatta he had sailed as a helmsman in fifteen years. Needless to say, it was somewhat humbling. Scott Anderson and his crew Brad Winslett also went to San Diego and was the top Texas boat.

Other Fleet 488 skippers and crews in the NAs were Bob Stoller, Mary Anne Byrne, and Bill Cabrall, as well as Jan Davis on Neil Hayes' boat.

On the Good Citizenship side, Fleet members were hard at work on a second Lightning to refit and donate to the Denver area Community Sailing Program early in 2007. More boats were added to the Fleet last year, and just as important, more crew and a heightened sense of excitement are part of a growing and sustaining fleet! We look forward to next summer and the continued participation of the unofficial MCDB sailing team from the University.
