we had a late season addition to the Fleet, with John Weiss purchasing Daisy and returning her to her home of the 80's, Lake Wallenpaupack.





There was a full program of club, inter-club and regatta sailing for the Lightnings based at the Little Egg Harbor Yacht Club this past summer.




