Here are some highlights from 2010 regattas:

- Newport Yacht Club – sailing on Irondequoit Bay: Two-Day Celebration of Spring regatta attracted fifteen boats. The winner was David Starck; runner-up was Mark Sertl. There were difficult conditions on Saturday and 20+ mph winds on Sunday.

The 2010 sailing season at Newport Yacht Club began early in the spring with the reconditioning of a forty-year old donated Lippincott, #11538. We started with John Atkins stripping all of the hardware and fittings, then sanding and painting the deck and bright work. By April or so we relocated the fine craft to Dick Hallagan's nice new garage for the reinstallation of new hardware fittings, control lines and floor boards. The fleet purchase of a newer mast and stainless steel center board to replace the old was a must for this project, and the price was right. I would like to thank Dick Hallagan for the use of his garage and kind donations for some of the new equipment we needed. Thanks to John Atkins, Lori Foster, Dan Pope and Al McReynolds for all lending a hand helping to complete this undertaking. "The Lippy" will be a great addition to our Fleet, and we believe it will help introduce new Lightning sailors into our club.

Spring sailing at our club started out a bit slow, mainly due to weather, with only two races sailed for the series. Dick Hallagan took the honors with first, Dan Pope second, Phil Lange third.

Newport Yacht Club has had another successful summer series with ten plus weeks of sailing on Thursday evenings. Sailing on the bay during the week avoids the weekend powerboat traffic and waves makes racing more enjoyable. Throughout the summer we had eight different Lightnings come out to sail and averaged around five boats each night, with a total of fifteen races. The final outcome for the T-night sailing was: Dick Hallagan taking honors, Al McReynolds a close second, Dan Pope third, Andy Smith fourth and Landy Atkinson rounding up the top five.

One note is that most every evening the bay had decent breeze so we never made it out to the big lake, which allowed the fleet to get back on shore earlier to enjoy the barbeque and beverages before dark.

The fall series had three boats competing with a total of two races. Dan Pope won the series, followed by Dick Hallagan and Phil Lange in third place.

After tallying all the series scores for club champion, Dick Hallagan ended up with the big honors, sailing a total of eighteen races, followed by Dan Pope second with fifteen races, Alan McReynolds third with ten races, Andy Smith fourth with nine races, followed by Phil Lange in fifth with eight races sailed throughout out the season.

Our annual "Celebration of Spring" regatta held June 5 and 6. With the help of Bill Toppings as PRO and Dan Pope and Al McReynolds as regatta co-chairmen, this past year's event went on with good success. Fifteen boats entered the regatta that supported an awesome Tex/Mex dinner from the famous "Moes" Restaurant.

Saturday we came to the club to see a cool gray over-cast day with the dreadful building west breeze. Folks that have witnessed Irondequoit Bay will tell you how difficult it is to sail when the breeze is strong out of the west. The Race Committee took the fleet south of the bridge, thinking this would be the best location to set up a course. One race was sailed in very puffy shifting conditions, with Bob Wardwell winning hands down, followed by Mark Sertl and Jed Dodge.

After the first race, the committee decided to relocate the race course north of the bridge, as the winds seemed more stable there—well not really, but we did manage to get off two more races in very difficult conditions.
