# Michigan



Fleet 54 completed another fantastic year of sailing in 2010. We had an active club racing schedule, as well as several members who travelled to regattas near and far. In addition, there were numerous related activities that helped keep our Fleet strong.

Before the racing started, we held a “Spring Recall” to roust everyone out of their winter funk and get them energized about the upcoming season. This year we were very fortunate to secure the services of Greg Fisher as a speaker at our event. Greg led the group of fifty sailors through an entertaining discussion of sail trim, explaining the importance and “how tos” of changing gears on a Lightning. We crowned our first winner of the year at the event. Jim Allen won the chili cook-off contest. One can only guess that the reason we never saw Jim on the race course this year was that he was concerned he would not be able to uphold this high level of performance on the water.

In 2010, our race slate consisted of 106 scheduled races on fifty-one dates from May 2 through October 13. We actually completed eighty-seven of them. The average number of boats in each of our races was thirteen, with a high of twenty-two. While this is down a little bit from years past, we still consider ourselves fortunate. Two races are planned for every Wednesday evening and Sunday. The season is divided into Spring, Summer and Fall Series, giving us a total of six major series. Races in these series are scored on an average low score basis, with a skipper needing to sail in at least one-half of the sailed races in a series to qualify for awards. Sunday Series winners were

Mark Whatley (Spring, Fall, Overall) and Tom Klaban (Summer). Wednesday Series winners were Mark Allen (Spring) and Tom Klaban (Summer, Fall, Overall).

In addition to the main series, we conduct three mini-regattas over the course of the season on the holiday weekends: Memorial Day, July 4<sup>th</sup> and Labor Day. Each regatta consists of five races over Sunday/Monday, and then we partake in the Club’s Holiday Potluck Picnic. This year, Tom Klaban swept the mini-regattas, winning all three.

Fleet 54 also conducts a Club Championship Regatta. This is a stand-alone, five-race event held on a Saturday/Sunday. This year’s winner was Tom Klaban.

To assist newer Fleet members who are just learning the boat, we run a “Rock Star” Wednesday night early in the season. For this event, we have a number top-of-the-fleet sailors volunteer to serve as crew for a skipper that may be looking for a little help. This year’s event had seven dedicated Rock Stars helping out and an equal number of now-better skippers.

We have two other special Wednesdays throughout the course of the season. The first is a “Junior Championship.” We encourage skippers to recruit a junior to skipper their boat for this event. Kevin Ziegler was this year’s Junior Champion.

The other special Wednesday event is the Commodore’s Challenge. This is an opportunity for crew members to get a chance to take the helm. We had seventeen boats participate in the 2010 edition of the Commodore’s Challenge. After tallying the scores from three close races, Eric Klaban was declared the winner.
