 during the year.


John, in addition to being one of the founding fathers of the Lightning Fleet and VLSC, you're still fast!





Fleet 435 had a tough year, as the recession forced many in our small Fleet to focus on careers. Beth Richard completed her move to California and her new job. Bill Biermann had a sharp turn in his life and had to sell his boat. Repairs on Jeff Camiel's boat trudged on as he battled with insurance and the shop while traveling extensively. Many in our small Fleet found themselves working more weekends or traveling in 2010.

The fleet ended the year on an up note. Jeff's boat was back at the club. Mark Boaz moved to Texas in December and joined our Fleet in January 2011. Our careers were looking more stable, and some of us were not on the road, as much for work but more for sailing. Fleet 435 has a strong core membership to build upon in the near future.

The Masthead Trophy is awarded to the skipper making the biggest bonehead move of the year. While the 2009 award might have been awarded to Clarke Newman a bit tongue in cheek, there is no doubt the award was won legitimately in 2010 by Clarke Newman. Clarke broke a wrist while stepping a mast to end his 2010 sailing. We do see a trend though—Clarke wins 2009 for touching a sign with his mast. Clarke wins 2010 for breaking a wrist stepping a mast. It is the Masthead Trophy—perhaps we should name this the Clarke Newman Masthead Trophy.

The Most Improved Skipper in 2010 is Aroldo de Rienzo. Aroldo stepped into a Lightning for the first time in 2009, as he began his campaign to represent Mexico in the 2011 Pan Am games. Aroldo is a fine skipper with plenty of racing experience, so his transition to the Lightning has been very smooth. He has quickly learned the nuances of a Lightning. We find Aroldo at the top of the leader board at all of our Southwestern circuit stops.

The Crew Trophy for best crew in 2010 goes to Ginger Womble. Ginger was very active in promoting and organizing the Southwestern circuit during 2010. Ginger not only sat foredeck for team Womble all year, she joined Aroldo de Rienzo's team for the NAs. She has become one of the best foredeck hands in Texas.

The Dr. Sylvan Newman Perpetual Trophy – Fleet Champion for 2010 is awarded to Aroldo de Rienzo. Aroldo was the top Texas skipper on the 2010 Southwestern Circuit. Aroldo is our current Texas champion. He continues his quest to represent Mexico in the Lightning Class during the 2011 Pan Am Games, and Fleet 435 is solidly behind its champion. His performance at the major Lightning regattas and on the Southwestern Circuit in 2010 was far above his fellow countrymen competing in the same events. Mexico should be proud to select such a competitor as Aroldo de Rienzo for its sailing team at the 2011 Pan Am Games.

The Captain's Trophy is awarded at the discretion of the Fleet Captain. There are no fixed criteria for this award. The 2010 Captain's Trophy is awarded to Clarke Newman for his efforts to promote Lightning sailing. Clarke chaired our committee bidding for the US Pan Am Trials, and has worked for a number of years to bring the NAs back to Texas. The 2012 NAs are in Texas. Clarke promotes not only Lightning sailing, but Class participation at all levels. The ILCA could not ask for a stronger advocate than Clarke Newman.

Who knew that being so cold and wet could be so much fun!

In April, Greg Fisher came to Denver to give the keynote address at Denver's Community Sailing (our local junior sailing organization) Annual Fundraiser Gala, found time to give the Fleet a coaching session for an afternoon, and used Lightnings to coach a junior seminar that weekend.

Fleet 488 was able to fill a table at the Community Sailing Gala with Steve and Jan Davis, Bill Cabrall, Raeyane Farrell, Rebecca Espinosa, Nick Farina, Elizabeth Henry-Hooker, and Dave Spira attending. Nick Farina stole the show in a canary yellow tuxedo!

Our wooden boat division started strong with Ben Beall, in Steamboat Springs getting his woody, #1477, into the shop to begin a restoration. Bill Cabrall rigged his "sort of" new wooden boat, #10154, and put it in the water. The good news is that it only leaked a little (Ha!).

Denver Sailing Association (DSA) opened local sailing in May with their 'Opening Day' celebration. DSA held their Hornblower Regatta in mid-May. This year Bill Cabrall not only won in the Lightning Fleet, but also brought home the Hornblower Cup, given for the lowest average score of the individual fleet winners. This year Lightnings were not the largest fleet out (Lasers), but Bill sailed a very consistent regatta. In forty-three years, Lightnings had never brought home this trophy before.

The best included a wonderful venue, time with a great team and great people, a fantastic regatta, and Bill's personal best moment ever in a Lightning—a picture perfect start in the fifth race the morning of the second day. Home with her doctors and an X-ray machine, we discovered that Rebecca had cracked a vertebrae. She has since fully recovered and is back in the boat, but it was a very scary event.

Steve Davis ended our sailing season in stellar style by winning the Bluenose Regatta. Steve and Laura Jeffers took time out from moving the Lightning Class Office from Denver to Florida to hook up with Brian Hayes in Nashville and dominated the regatta, totaling only eight points in three races!
