The Annisquam Yacht Club, AYC, sailing on Ipswich Bay, Gloucester, Massachusetts, in 1994 established the Smith Trophy in memory of the late U.S. Senator, Benjamin A. Smith, a legendary Lightning and later Etchells sailor. The Trophy is awarded to a club member:

"in recognition of outstanding achievement in or extraordinary contributions to the sport of sailing."

Smith, with his children, Russell, Ben, and Suzie, was Fleet 151 champion for many years, won several New England District Championships in the late 1950s and early 1960s and, subsequently, won an Etchells' nationals.



The award, not given each year, was given in 2012 to Dr. Georges Peter, who won AYC championships and Marblehead Race Week in different classes, including the Lightnings, the New England Districts in 1973, six Massachusetts Lightning

championships, and the 1972 Presidents Cup. He has raced his beloved Mouette, eight Lightnings in total, continuously since 1956, now completing fifty-eight years in the Class. He most recently finished 8th in the 2013 International Masters in Italy and 5th in the North American Masters. Other successful campaigns have included the following:

- Racing in more than 20 North Americans, qualifying for the Blue Fleet on seven occasions.
- Sailing in six World Championships, finishing 12th in Finland in 1995 and 16th in Dallas in 1979
- Finishing Runner-Up in the 2001 Presidents Cup
- Competing frequently in the Master's with a best finish of 4th in 1995

In receiving the award, the AYC noted his dedication to the Lightning Class, in addition to his devotion to his family (his wife Carolyn and his daughter Allison are accomplished Lightning sailors), and to his career, specializing in pediatric infectious diseases, all of which made him "a most deserving recipient of the Smith Trophy." Georges also was Commodore of the New England District (1979-1980) and is a former ILCA Vice-President (1982-1991).

Peter continues to race regularly. He looks forward to the 2014 Southern Circuit, sailing with his long-standing and outstanding crew, C. H. Ritt from Marblehead, Massachusetts, who began sailing with Peter in 1976, and Eva Burpee from Rye, New York, who has crewed with Georges and CH since 2010.


The Nigeria Lightning National Championships were held in May with twenty boats participating in nine races over two days.

We have two active series throughout the season. The Sunday AM Series, comprising short one lap races every Sunday morning, was won by Jon Varley, with Chris Clarke second. The Principal Series comprises one longer race, usually two laps, on Sunday afternoons from the start of the season in May until Labor Day. This year Tom Varley won the series, with Bob Shutt second and Chris Clarke third.

The final event of the season is the Club Championship Sail-off Series in which the qualifying skippers sail as many races as boats qualified, with skippers and crews switching boats for every race. This year Tom Varley regained the championship, beating last year's winner Bob Shutt, who came in second. Dave Samanich came third.

James Taylor from Cowan Lake Sailing Association, near Wilmington, with his crew Carl Taylor and George Auer, won our Seventeenth Annual Bare Bones. Tom Varley, with his crew of Jon Varley and Matt Buchanan, from Mansfield Sailing Club, took second place, and Eric Brandt, with Becky Young and Nick Brandt, from Leatherlips Yacht Club, were third. Bob Shutt, with his crew of Zach Austin and Lisa Meadows, from Mansfield, came in fourth.

Sunny skies and steady westerly breezes of 10–15 mph were perfect sailing conditions, which produced intense competition between the ten participating boats. Two two-lap races on a windward-leeward course were held on Saturday afternoon. Racing was then abandoned when a severe thunderstorm blew through the area, producing winds in the 20–30 mph range with heavy rain and hail. Racing resumed on Sunday morning under sunny skies and moderate breezes of 5–10 mph, and two more races were completed.

Five boats from Mansfield competed, and visitors came from Cowan Lake, near Wilmington, Indian Lake, near Russells Point, Leatherlips, near Columbus, and Erie, Pennsylvania.

Other sailboat classes came into the club and eventually disappeared; a testament to the appeal of the Lightning class.
