#### Fleet 488 End-of-2013 Season Banquet, January 25, 2014

Twenty Fleet 488 members and guests met at the Aspen Room of the Heather Gardens clubhouse for a most enjoyable evening of socializing and dining, along with a short business meeting. We particularly appreciated the potluck contributions, especially those from the Cabralls, who brought two kinds of Lasagna, using Bill's mother's favorite recipes, and from the Tabers, who brought an exquisite mushroom sautéed chicken main dish. We gave special thanks to Evan Morris, who helped us arrange use of the Heather Gardens facility.

At the business meeting, Fleet Captain David Thompson gave a presentation listing the highlights of the 2013 season, and Bill Cabrall won the Fleet 488 Championship perpetual trophy. David was re-elected to his third year as Fleet Captain, and Jan Davis was re-elected as Fleet Secretary.

Among the highlights of the 2013 season were the participation of Steve Davis and David Spira in the World Championships in Italy; Bill and Raeyanne's wedding on September 7; and David Spira's participation in the 2013 Championship on Champions, sailed in Lightnings, with Philip Ryan and Rebecca Espinosa on board.

#### 2014 Lightning Southern Circuit

Twelve Fleet 488 members arrived in Florida on March 15 to take part in the 2014 Lightning Southern Circuit. Teams Cabrall (Bill, Raeyane, and Christine) and Thompson (David, Norm Jarvis, and Lori England) brought their boats; Jim England and Rob Merritt crewed for Bill Mauk of the Coral Reef Yacht Club; and Steve Davis helmed a boat brought to Florida by Brian Hayes in Miami, and in turn crewed for Brian in St Pete. Rebecca Bevit crewed on Rochester-based Dick Hallagan's boat. Barb Thompson and Jan Davis provided shore support for the Fleet 488 team.

In Miami, Team Thompson placed 50<sup>th</sup> out of 53; in St Pete they placed 55<sup>th</sup> out of 57; and in the Masters in St. Pete they placed 28<sup>th</sup> out of 30. Overall, for Miami and St. Pete combined, they were 45<sup>th</sup> out of 46.

They were not last!

In the Circuit overall, Bill Cabrall and crew placed 42<sup>nd</sup> out of 46;; and Bill Mauk placed 20<sup>th</sup> out of 46. Dick Hallagan placed 25<sup>th</sup>. Steve Davis placed 18<sup>th</sup> out of 53 in the Miami Midwinter Championship.

Team Thompson had some bad luck, ripping their chute in Miami and breaking their main halyard in the last trace in St. Pete. Fortunately they had a spare chute to use for the remainder of the races.

Winds were higher than usual in Miami, in the vicinity of 15–20 knots on days 1 and 2, and 20–24 knots on day 3, the result of a front passing through just prior to racing that day. The rock stars at the front of the pack all described their various tech-

niques for gaining speed as they surfed down the front sides of the four-foot waves; Teams Thompson and Cabrall just focused on keeping their boats from capsizing. They succeeded, even as others went over during downwind gybes.

Winds in St. Pete were as they have been in years past—enough to run the first race on a 10:00 AM start, then dying off for a few hours before a sea breeze filled in. There were three races completed on day one, and only one race completed on days 2 and 3.

As always, it was an enjoyable circuit for the Fleet 488 participants.

### 2014 DSA Thaw-out Series April 5–May 3

Early spring weather on Cherry Creek Reservoir is not always the best for sailboat racing, and that held true for 2014. With water temperatures in the 40s and sometimes gusty winds, we raced in just three of the five Saturdays in the series. The last race day of the series was the best, weather wise, and four Lightnings came out that day: teams Quest, Blue Two, Dandy Lion, and Quintessence. The weather forecast had called for a high of 82 degrees with westerly winds at 8–11 mph, and that's what we got, except that winds died back considerably in the second race, making for a slow and painful beat up to the finish line after rounding the last mark.

Team Quintessence won the Lightning division in the series, with Bob Stoller at the helm for all the races of the series.

The Thaw-out Series also served as the debut for the relaunch of Norm Jarvis' Lightning #11457, purchased by Evan Morris last fall, and repainted over the winter a bright chili pepper red, and renamed *Lil' Peppa*. Unfortunately, Evan was not able to race her in the series, but he proudly unveiled her on April 5, the first day of the series.

### 2014 DSA Shootout/Hornblower Regatta, May 17–18

Five Lightnings came out for the regatta and thus were able to fleet. Teams Quest, Blue Two, Dandy Lion, and Davis were joined by Bob Stoller's North Star to make the five. Team Quest sailed with Bill and Raeyanne, and Keith Martenez on Saturday, and with Christine on Sunday; Team Dandy Lion sailed with Lucas and Carter, and with Nate on Saturday and Garrett on Sunday; Team Blue Two sailed with David and Norm, and with Rob on Saturday and Kai Thompson on Sunday. Team North Star sailed with Bob, Brenna Copeland, and Jeff Walsh on both days, and, likewise, team Davis sailed with Steve, Jan, and Francine on both days.



The light winds on Saturday made for enjoyable sailing, although the challenge in getting to the front of the pack was in finding a wind line and staying in it all the way to the next mark. That was especially evident in the last race of the day, when *Blue Two* stayed left on the final run to the 7 mark and kept in the wind, whereas the other Lightnings stayed in the middle of the course and fell into a no-wind hole fully occupied by 7 Buccs. While all boats arrived at the 7 mark at about the same time, *Blue Two* was able to sneak in ahead of *Quest*, round, and get to the finish line ahead of *Quest*, who, unfortunately, hit the mark as they tried to squeeze in between *Blue Two* and the mark (they did not have overlap going in and thus could not request mark room), and had to do a penalty turn, putting them in last place for that race.

On Sunday the winds were stronger than forecasted in the morning, Consequently, team *Blue Two* returned to the dock before the start of the first race, where they joined Team *Quest* who was waiting for their third crew to arrive. Once the missing crew arrived, both boats headed back out to the race course, and on the way out saw Team Davis drop Jan at the end of the main dock, then head back out to continue the first race, sailing double handed. In the meantime, Teams *Dandy Lion* and *North Star* were racing, but, unfortunately, the *Dandy Lions* broached in a gybe with chute up and capsized, turning turtle, to end their first race in the first downwind leg. They struggled to get the boat back up, and when it did, they saw their chute had torn a large hole near the top during the recovery. So the first race ended with *North Star* in first place, Davis in second, with the other three scored as DNC.

For the remaining two races, the finishes were predictably Team Davis in first place, with teams *North Star*, *Quest*, and *Blue Two* in hot pursuit, with *Dandy Lion*, sailing without chute, trailing behind.

For the regatta, Team Davis had six bullets and a throw-out for first place, *North Star* a well-deserved second place, *Quest* in third place, *Blue Two* in fourth place, and *Dandy Lion* last.

### 2014 DSA Spring Series, May 8–July 10

Lightnings sailed on seven out of the ten race days in the 2014 DSA Spring Series, with between four and six Lightnings out each time. Teams Davis, *Quest*, *Blue Two*, *Dandy Lion*, *Quintessence*, and *Family Affair* all participated and finished the series in that order. During the series, we welcomed new Lightning crew Dylan Manney, Kirill Businov, junior sailor Elizabeth Lemley, and Ms Ryan McCauley. Ryan had been a collegiate sailor at Cal Berkeley before taking her Master's degree at Stanford and then arriving in Denver to teach in a Denver Charter school. And in a surprising turn of events, Evan Morris sold *Lil' Peppa* to DSA Commodore and Finn Sailor Curtis Rist, who had always wanted to own a Lightning. Curtis did some tune-up and repair work on the boat and renamed her *Loucetios*, the Celtic god of wind. He didn't sail her in the Spring Series but had big plans to come out and make a mark in the Summer Series.

### Aspen Open Regatta July 19–20

Three DSA Lightnings, teams *Dandy Lion*, *Dandy Lion 2*, and *North Star*, traveled to Reudi Reservoir, thirty-five miles up the Frying Pan River from Basalt, Colorado, to compete

in the 2014 Aspen Open Regatta. Team North Star had Bob Stoller at the helm, with Jeff Walsh forward and Curtis Rist at middle. Team Dandy Lion had Nate Hostetter at helm with Adam Hostetter forward and Zach Hostetter at middle. Team Dandy Lion 2, actually Steve Davis' Lightning #15256, had Lucas Armstrong at helm, with Carter Spenser forward and Garrett Shields at middle.

The Lightnings sailed in the Portsmouth fleet — it took four of a class to fleet — along with three sunfish and a Mutineer.

Skipper Lucas Armstrong filed this report:

There were three races on Saturday, one of which had a reach with a starboard-rounded G mark. *North Star* and *Dandy Lion 2* fought it out and had a photo finish, however, only *Dandy Lion* and the *Mutineer* sailed the proper course, going to mark 6. There was a protest, after which the *Mutineer*, that had dropped out of racing and was unaware of the protest, observed all the Sunfish round the improper mark 3 at the time that the *Dandy Lion* was making its way out to the correct mark 6.

Needless to say, there was some frustration, but it was good, close racing. Bob Stoller, with his old crafty ways and sharp crew, out sailed the two *Dandy Lions*. *Dandy Lion 2* had a great last race with a bit of luck and excellent wind reading and calls by her crew on Sunday.

*North Star* was 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Sunfish went 1, 2.

## 2014 DSA Summer Series, July 17–September 18

Seven Lightnings sailed on six out of the ten race days in the DSA 2014 Summer Series. Evening thunderstorms kept us off the water on three of the race days, and all of the usual DSA Lighting competitors were traveling to the Lightning North American Championships on one of them, August 7. Teams Davis, Family Affair, Blue Two, Quest, Loucetos, Dandy Lion, and Quintessence all raced in one or more races in the series, finishing the series in that order. The nicest evening of the series was the last one, September 18, with steady light winds, but with encroaching darkness due to the proximity of the autumnal equinox and a 7 :00 PM sunset, there was time for only one race, won in a close finish by *Blue Two*. Team Vargish on *Family Affair* showed strength throughout the series, placing second for the series and finishing in first place in three of the races they sailed.

## 2014 Lightning WJMs and North American Championships, August 9–15

Team Quest, with Bill, Raeyane, and Christine on board, placed 30<sup>th</sup> in the Masters Championships, August 9–11, in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, and Bill Mauk, sailing with Fleet 488 crew Jim England and Rob Merritt, placed 16<sup>th</sup>.

In the North American Championships, Teams Quest, Bill, Raeyane, and local junior sailor Noah Bartelt, and *Blue Two*, David, Norm Jarvis, and Lori England, qualified for and com-

peted in the Governor's Cup Yellow Fleet Division; Jim England crewed for Bill Mauk, with Michele Sumpton, and they qualified for and competed in the Championship Blue Fleet Division. Team Quest finished in 12<sup>th</sup> place the Yellow Fleet, Team Mauk 32<sup>nd</sup> in the Blue Fleet. Team *Blue Two* finished last in every race they sailed, although they got noticeably closer to the boats ahead of them by the last race on Friday

It was an interesting regatta. 107 boats registered, better than any NAs in the last twenty years. The weather was sometimes challenging, as follows:

Monday, qualifiers day 1: two races scheduled, with boats organized into three fleets, with assignment of boat-to-fleet by schedule, different assignments for each of the four qualifying races. We waited on the water until 1:00 PM for wind to come up, and got the first two fleets started, although, with three general recalls for each, it took a while. After the first general recall for the third fleet (the one Quest and *Blue Two* were in), we were all sent back to the dock to wait for a thunderstorm to pass. It didn't. That ended day 1.

Tuesday, qualifiers day 2: we needed to finish race 1 and then get in three more races for each of the three fleets. But a cold front had gone through in the middle of the night, bringing heavy rain and 20–25 knot winds, with seven-foot waves flooding over the breakwater. We sat out the morning and early afternoon at the yacht club in an on-shore postponement. We finally went out at 3:00 PM after wind had subsided to 10–15 range, but with big, six-foot rollers on the race course. *Blue Two* and Quest checked in with RC, then decided that it was too dangerous for them rolling in waves that big and came back in. Race 1 for fleet 3 was started and completed. Then race 2 was started for each of the three fleets, but then the wind died, and all boats were TLE after rolling in the six-foot waves with no wind for two hours. The Fleet 488 crews watched from the bar at the yacht club.



Wednesday, qualifiers day 3: (was supposed to be NA races day 1) a beautiful, sunny day with ten-knot breezes. The waves had subsided to almost nothing—much better than Tuesday! We sailed two qualifier races, then went back to the dock to wait for the results, assignment of competitors to their fleets, and then wait the required one-hour period for filing of protests and the subsequent one-hour allotted slot for jury hearings. The RC sent us back out after that, but on the way out to the race course, the wind died.

Thursday, championship series races 1, 2, and 3. Another beautiful, sunny day with eight-knot breezes. Now that's more like it! We started at 9:00 AM instead of 10:00 to make sure we'd get in three races, and we did. Winds occasionally got lighter, but were very steady in direction. Our kind of sailing! We could have done a fourth race, as we had time and the wind.

Friday, championship series races 4, 5, and 6: yet another beautiful sunny day with six-knot breezes that died down to 3–4 mph occasionally in the second race. Then, at 1:00 PM, the legendary southerly sea breeze kicked it, 12–14 knots, we got our third race of the day, hiking hard and surfing downwind in the two-foot waves. What a great way to finish the series! Competitors, after packing up their boats, headed over to the Blue Harbor destination resort, very elegant, for the awards banquet.

In spite of the weather challenges, it was a most enjoyable regatta.

### **DSA Fall Frostbite Regatta, September 20–21**

The third September weekend has been the traditional date for the DSA-hosted Colorado Governor's Cup Regatta, but this year the Governor's Cup was sailed on Lake Dillon, on Labor Day weekend. So that left the third weekend available for a local, Denver-area regatta, that we called the Fall Frostbite Regatta.

So, on a beautiful weekend for racing we had six Lightnings on the line at the 2014 DSA Fall Frostbite Regatta: Teams Cabrall, Thompson, Rist, Vargish, Davis, and a CSC Junior team, sailing the Davis' other Lightning.

On Saturday we went into postponement at noon because there was no wind, and at 2:00 PM RC brought us back to the dock for an on-shore postponement. Winds began to pick up at 3:00 PM, so everybody came back out, and we got two races in before it was time to call it a day.

On Sunday we went into an on-shore postponement at 10:30, waiting for wind, then headed out to the race course at 11:45 when it seemed like the wind was coming up. Team Rist, with crew Isaac Hayden and Dylan Maney, took 2<sup>nd</sup>, nice results for a boat that has seen almost no action this summer. Team Vargish, with the entire family on board, along with Pete Horsch and son Owen, took 3<sup>rd</sup>, sailing consistently in every

race. Team Thompson, with Norm Jarvis and Kirill Businov on board, took 4<sup>th</sup>. Rounding out the last two places were team Davis, with Steve and Jan double-handing, and the CSC Junior team, with skipper Marnix Hoogwater, and crew Chloe Brand and Quinn Donaldson, sailing well upwind, but losing places downwind without flying a spinnaker.

We enjoyed this local Denver-area regatta as much as we had enjoyed past Governor's Cups and look forward to 2015, when the Governor's Cup will return again to Cherry Creek Reservoir.

Never in our recent memory did we have such nice sailing weather in the fall. It was a great way to end the season.
