

61st Annual Whitecap Regatta Notice of Race & Sailing Instructions

Pontiac Yacht Club, 3270 Wards Point, Orchard Lake Village, Michigan

September 12th & 13th, 2020

1. ELIGIBILITY AND RULES

The regatta will be open on all ILCA member Lightning sailings and will be governed by the following rules, except as modified by the sailing instructions and notices:

- a. The 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- b. The Rules Governing All Lightning Class District/Area Championships.
- c. The US Sailing prescriptions to rules 60.3, 63.2 and 63.4 shall not apply.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located on the front [north] of the club house.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted ½ hour prior to Harbor Gun on the day that it will take effect, except any changes to the schedule of races shall be posted by 7:00PM on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the committee boat, "[Old Blue](#)"

When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in race signal AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

The skipper's meeting will be held at 11:30AM on Saturday.

Harbor Gun shall be 12:15PM on Saturday.

The warning signal for the first race on Saturday will be at 1:00PM.

Subsequent races will be held as soon as possible after the end of the previous race.

Harbor Gun shall be 09:15AM on Sunday

The Warning Signal for the first race on Sunday will be at 10:00AM.

Subsequent races will be held as soon as possible after the end of the previous race.

Three races will be attempted on Saturday.

Two races will be attempted on Sunday.

One extra race per day may be sailed.

On Sunday, no warning signal will be made after 1:00PM.

6. CLASS FLAG

The Lightning Class Flag shall be used.

7. RACING AREA

The racing area will be Cass Lake, Michigan.

8. THE COURSES

Four leg, Windward-Leeward, indicated by the Numeral Pennant "4" (Red with a white cross)

Five leg, Windward-Leeward, indicated by the numeral pennant "5" (Yellow & Blue)

Five leg, Triangle-Windward-Leeward indicated by Code Flag "O" (Yellow & Red diagonals)

The course flag will be displayed one minute prior to the warning signal.

If a Numeral Pennant "1" (White with a red circle) or "2" (Blue with a white circle) is displayed with the course flag, the number of legs (oriented in a windward-leeward direction) indicated by the pennant will be added to the course.

All marks will be left to port, except when there is a gate in which case boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark.

9. MARKS

Marks other than offset marks will be orange or yellow tetrahedrons or yellow cylinder buoys.

Offset marks, if used, will be "Hippity Hops."

A "Hippity Hop" "guard mark" may be attached to the committee boat for the start. Hitting the guard mark or sailing between it and the committee boat is the same as hitting the committee boat.

10. THE START

Races will be started using rule 26 with the warning signal given five minutes before the starting signal.

One minute prior to the warning signal, there will be multiple horn blasts.

The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the starboard end and the course side edge of a tetrahedron mark or yellow buoy at the port end.

A boat starting later than ten minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS. This changes rule A4.1

11. CHANGE OF THE POSITION OF THE NEXT MARK

To change the position of the next mark, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. The change will be signaled before the leading boat has begun the leg, although the new mark may not yet be in position. Any mark to be rounded after rounding the new mark may be relocated without further signaling to maintain the course configuration. When in a subsequent change the new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

12. THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the port end and the course side edge of a red ball buoy at the starboard end of the finishing line.

13. PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.2 shall apply, except that when an infringing boat has its spinnaker drawing at the time of the infringement, drops it completely while taking her penalty, and resets it and has it drawing after the penalty, the penalty is one turn penalty as provided in RSS or Racing Rules of Sailing. This changes Rule 44.1.

A boat that has retired under rule 44.1(b) shall notify the race committee within the protest time limit.

14. PROPULSION.

Rule 42.3(c) is changed to prohibit pulling in on the guy, and to limit the pulling of the mainsheet to the part between the crew member and the first block on the boom. Changes RRS 42.3(c).

15. TIME LIMITS

The time limit for the first boat to finish each race shall be two hours. Boats that are attempting to finish but fail to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored 2 more than the last boat to finish within the time limit. This changes rules 35 and A 4.1.

16. PROTESTS

Boats planning on protesting, should report their intent to the race committee, as they finish.

Protest forms are available in the club house. Protests shall be delivered to the protest box in the club house within 30 minutes after the race committee boat docks. The protest time limit and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after racing each day in the club house.

Notices of protests by the race committee will be posted to inform boats under rules 61.1(b).

A list of decisions made by the Protest Committee will be posted. On the last day of racing, requests for redress and requests to re-open a hearing must be lodged within 30 minutes of the time final results have been posted. This changes rules 62.2 and 66.

17. SCORING

- a. One race will constitute a series.
- b. There will be a maximum of six races for the regatta.
- c. If six races are scored, the worst race for each competitor will be excluded.
- d. The Low Point System of Appendix A shall be used with the following changes:
- e. "DNC", "DNS", "DNF", and "RAF" score points equal to one more than the number of boats entered in the series.

- f. "OCS", "DNE", "BFD", and "DSQ" score points equal to two more than the number of boats entered in the series. Changes A 4.2

18. TIES

- a. Boats which tie in a single race shall score points equal to the best position involved. The position(s) immediately after shall remain vacant (if two boats tie for first place, both are scored 1 point, and the next boat to finish scores 3 points). This paragraph modifies rule A7.
- b. When there is a tie on total points between two or more boats at the end of a series, the tie will be broken in favor of the boat or boats with the most first places, and, when a tie remains, the most second places, and so on. When a tie still remains, it shall be broken in favor of the boat which beats the other(s) in the last untied race of the series. All races, including those excluded in calculating total scores shall be considered for the purpose of breaking ties. This paragraph modifies A8.2.

17. SAFETY REGULATIONS

Each boat shall carry safety equipment conforming to government regulations class rules, and US Sailing or ISAF rules.

Boats are required to report in and verbally give the race committee their sail number prior to the start of their first race each day. A boat that retires from a race or chooses to return to the club prior to a subsequent race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

18. REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the race committee.

Substitution of damaged or lost equipment, except safety equipment, will not be allowed unless approved by the race committee.

19. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions.

20. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to the top Three (3) places.

21. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, decision to race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
